Sixth Annual American Film Institute (AFI) Golf Classic Returns to the Riviera Country Club, September 22, 2003

LOS ANGELES, CA, September 3, 2003— For the sixth consecutive year, the AFI Golf Classic will return to the famed Riviera Country Club on Monday, September 22, 2003 rallying a host of film and television golfers to support the AFI.

Yorkin commented, "The AFI Golf Classic is a well-loved, good-spirited fundraiser that brings players back year after year. We've raised nearly two million dollars for the American Film Institute and have had a great time doing it. This year will be just as great."
