AFI AWARDS TO BE PRESENTED ON JANUARY 11, 2008

HONOREES ANNOUNCED DECEMBER 16

HEWLETT-PACKARD CONTINUES COMMITMENT TO SCHOLARSHIPS FOR AFI CONSERVATORY

LOS ANGELES, August 20, 2007—AFI AWARDS 2007, the eighth chapter in the American Film Institute's 21st century almanac, which records each year's most outstanding achievements in film and television, will be announced on Sunday, December 16, 2007. Ten AFI Movies of the Year, 10 AFI Television Programs of the Year and up to 10 AFI Moments of Significance will be determined by AFI's unique selection process.

AFI will honor the creative ensembles for each of the honorees at a luncheon sponsored by Hewlett-Packard on Friday, January 11, 2008, at the Four Seasons Hotel in Los Angeles.

AFI AWARDS honorees are selected by two distinguished juries—one for motion pictures and one for television. The 13 members of each jury will discuss, debate and determine the 10 most outstanding motion pictures and television programs of the year, which are announced in alphabetical order. Each jury also selects up to five respective Moments of Significance.

HP will again create 20 scholarships for the AFI Conservatory, one for each of the AFI AWARDS honorees. The AFI Conservatory is world-renowned for its advanced training of the next generation of storytellers.

AFI AWARDS is the only form of national recognition that honors the creative ensemble as a whole—those people in front of and behind the camera—acknowledging the collaborative nature of film and television.

Deadline for all television submissions is November 1, 2007. Film submissions are due on November 9. Details about the selection process, submission forms and lists of past AFI AWARDS honorees are available on AFI's website at www.AFI.com.
